



PERSONAL WELLBEING INDEX Indians report improved personal

relationships and sense of community amidst the Coronavirus lockdown **Team CVoter** conducted a series of surveys in December

2019, April 2020 and May 2020 to find out the Personal Wellbeing Index (PWI) of Indians across the country. The PWI asks respondents about their levels of satisfaction corresponding to different domains in their life such as their standard of living, health, personal relationships, future security and others.






at home and practice social distancing. However, despite socially isolating, Indians have reported a higher level of satisfaction with feeling part of a community and their personal relationships.






