
level of trust Indians placed in all media sources, including news channels, newspapers and social media. In 2020, as compared to 2018, the trust Indians

declined the most, followed by newspapers and TV news channels. this change in trust in various media sources










All survey findings and projections are based on the Team CVoter "Trust in Institutions" survey carried out in 2010, 2018 and 2020
