Indians report increased levels of trust in the Prime Minister

Team CVoter conducted a series of surveys to find out the level of trust Indians placed in the Prime Minister and their Chief Ministers.

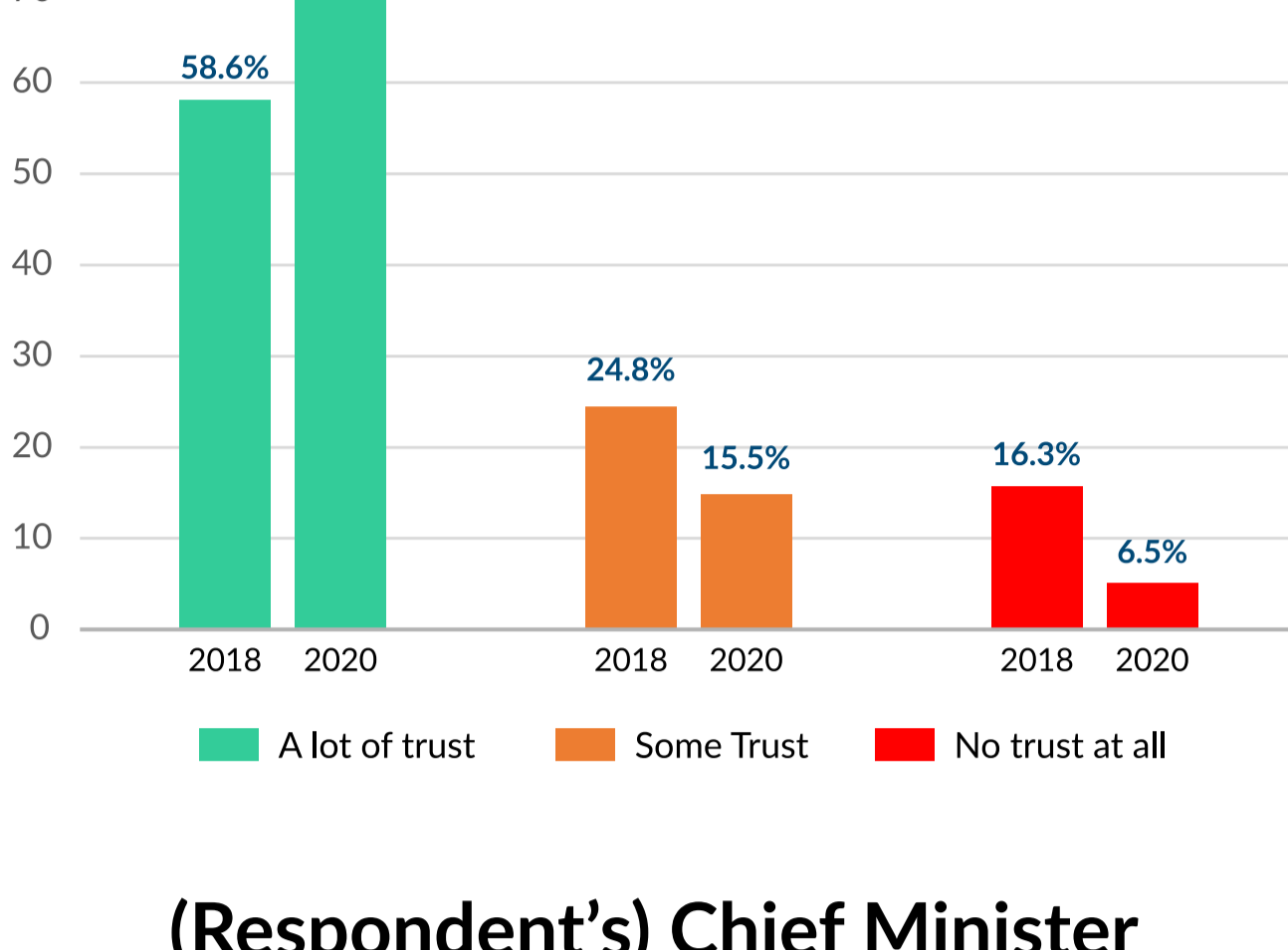
In 2020, as compared to 2018, the trust Indians place in the Prime Minister, Narendra Modi has increased by 17.7%.

Team Polstrat breaks down this increase in trust across demographics in India.

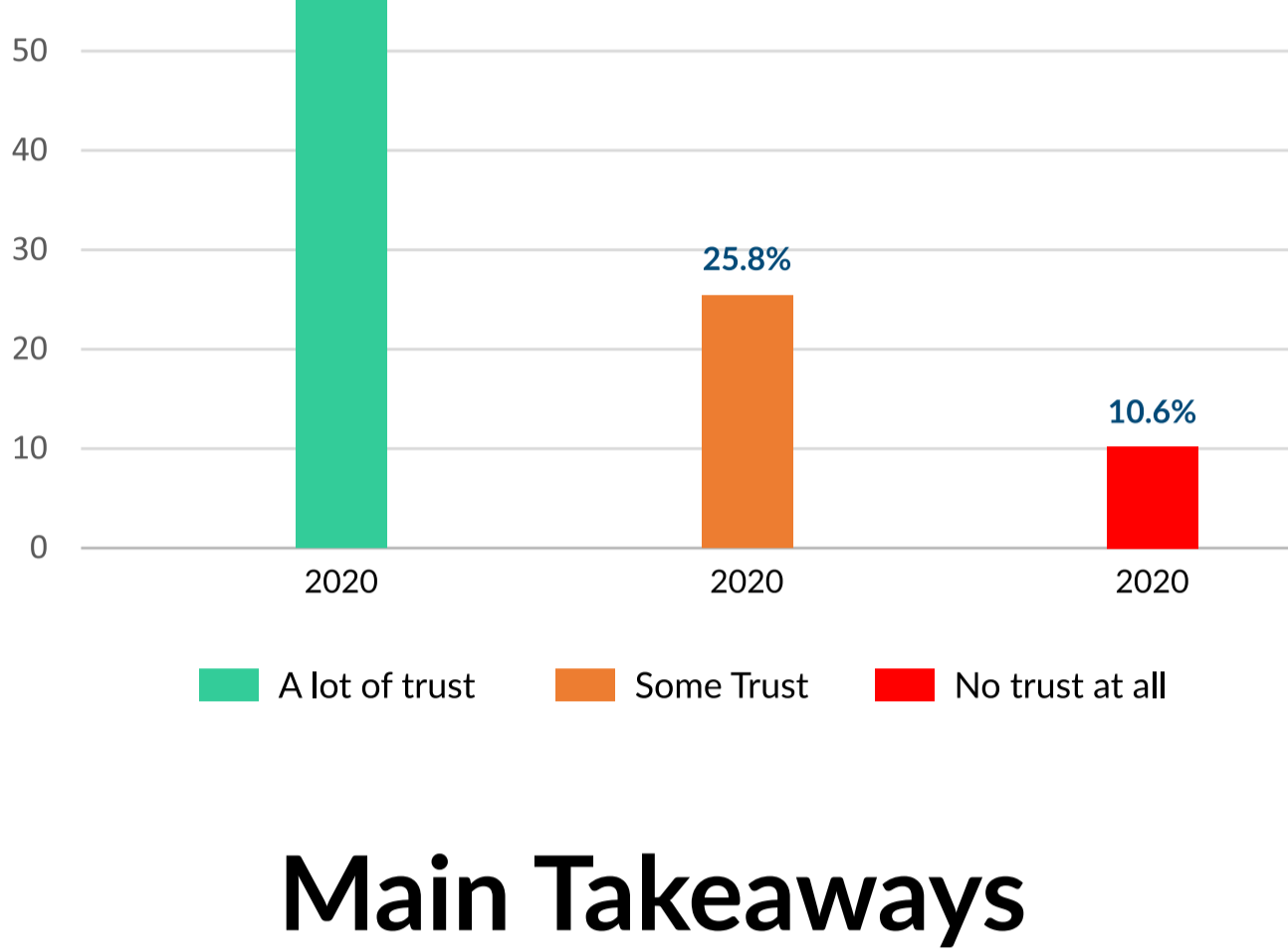


Q How much do you trust the following institutions? Do you have; a lot of trust, some trust or no trust at all in the Prime Minister/Chief Minister?

Prime Minister

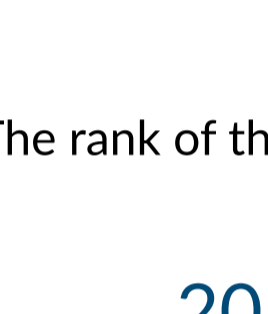


(Respondent's) Chief Minister



Main Takeaways

2020 Indians registered a **17.7% increase** in trust in the Prime Minister



The Prime Minister was deemed more trustworthy (**76.3%**) than Chief Ministers (**58.9%**) by respondents

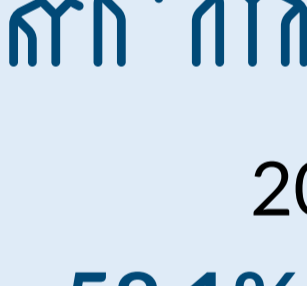

Breaking Down 2020 Data

Prime Minister

All demographics, across, age, gender, social, income and education groups recorded an **increase in trust** in the Prime Minister



Both males and females recorded **increased trust** in the Prime Minister, however, the percentage increase was much higher for males (22.5%) than females (6.2%)

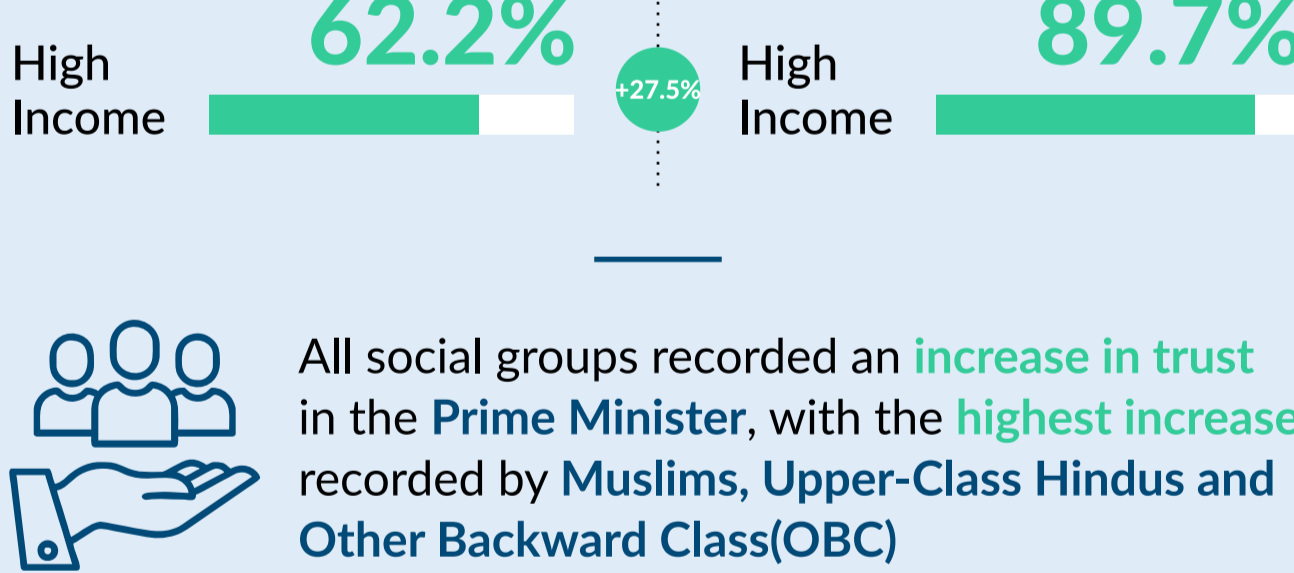

Across income groups, there was an **increase in trust** in the Prime Minister. The percentage **increase in trust**, rises as income rises.

All social groups recorded an **increase in trust** in the Prime Minister, with the **highest increase** recorded by Muslims, Upper-Class Hindus and Other Backward Class(OBC)

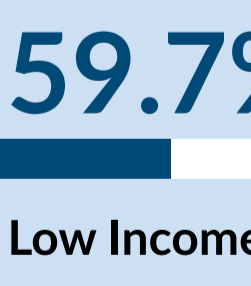

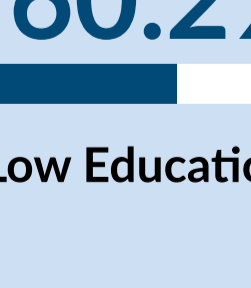

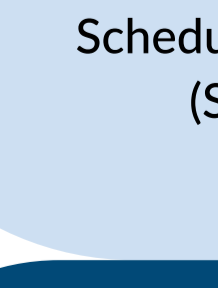

Both males and females recorded a similar level of trust in Chief Ministers. However, males have a slightly higher level of trust (60.4%) than females (57.3%)



Out of all social groups, Scheduled Tribes (ST), Upper-Class Hindus and Other Backward Class(OBC) recorded the highest level of trust in Chief Ministers.

All survey findings and projections are based on the Team CVoter "Trust in Institutions" survey carried out in 2010, 2018 and 2020 among 18+ adults statewide, including every major demographic.

The data is weighted to the known demographic profile of every state, including age group, social group, income, region, gender and education levels.
